Dr. Carlos Seiglie is an economist with particular expertise in Cuban and Latin American economic and political relations, as well as a corporate consulting background. He has expertise in topics as diverse as Cuban economic reform, defense economics, the growth of market-oriented economies in Russia and Eastern Europe, and Latin American economic practices and development. His expertise is drawn from a background that combines experience in consulting with academic credentials from the University of Chicago and Rutgers.
