Professor Shaw is a CPA and he teaches financial accounting. His research has been published in leading academic journals in accounting, finance, and management, including The Accounting Review; The journal of Accounting Research; Contemporary Accounting Research; Journal of Financial and Quantitative Analysis; Journal of the American Taxation Association, Journal of Financial Research; Journal of Accounting, Auditing and Finance; Strategic Management Journal; Journal of Business, Finance, and Accounting; Review of Quantitative Finance and Accounting; Research in Accounting Regulation; Journal of Financial Statement Analysis; Journal of Business Research; and others. Professor Shaw currently serves on the editorial boards of the Journal of Business Research and Research in Accounting Regulation.
