M^a Mar Galindo Merino graduated in Spanish Studies from the University of Alicante (Spain) in 2002. She specialized in Second Language Acquisition and the Teaching of English and other Modern Languages at the University of Pennsylvania (2004). She was also trained to teach Spanish by the Instituto Cervantes. She has been teaching Spanish in Spain and in the US since then. She has published several articles, book chapters and book reviews in journals such as *TESOL Quarterly*, *Cuadernos Cervantes*, *Studies in Second Language Acquisition*, *Estudios de Lingüística* and *Language Teaching Research*. Her PhD (2010) focused on the learning of Spanish as a second and foreign language, and was partly developed at the prestigious Department of Second Language Studies at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa.

Since 2007 she is an Assistant Professor of Linguistics at the University of Alicante, where she teaches both General and Applied Linguistics. She also gives Spanish classes to graduate students at the School of Economics of the University of Alicante. Since 2008 she trains Spanish language teachers in the *Máster en enseñanza de español como lengua extranjera* offered by the Universidad Internacional Menéndez Pelayo (UIMP) and the Instituto Cervantes. Furthermore, she teaches English to health workers in hospitals in a training program from the Escuela Valenciana de Estudios de la Salud (EVES).

Her academic interests include Sociolinguistics, Pragmatics and Second Language Acquisition. She is a member of the research group ACQUA (Research on Second and Foreign Language Acquisition at the University of Alicante).
